

Minutes of joint meeting with IJSO & IASO secretariat dt 17 Oct 2025

1. Welcome Address

The meeting began with a welcome address by Dr. S. P. Somashekhar, Chairman and Editor-in-Chief, Indian Journal of Surgical Oncology (IJSO). He welcomed the newly constituted Editorial Board and expressed appreciation for the contributions of the previous board in strengthening the journal's academic standing.

2. Confirmation of Minutes

The minutes of the previous joint IJSO-IASO Editorial Board meeting held on 26th September 2024 at Bengaluru were confirmed.

3. Presentation by Springer Nature (India)

Ms. Deepshikha Chauhan, representing Springer India, presented the annual performance report of IJSO. Key highlights included:

- The median time to acceptance has reduced significantly to 79 days.
- The Impact Factor of IJSO increased from 0.62 to 0.77 for the year 2024.
- The number of manuscript submissions has shown a consistent upward trend over recent years, reflecting the growing visibility of the journal.

4. New Editorial Board Initiatives

Dr. Pankaj Kumar Garg, Executive Editor, presented the new initiatives launched under the guidance of Dr. S.P.Soma shekhar, Editor-in-Chief:

a. **Reviewer Recognition:** Six top reviewers were felicitated based on the quantity and quality of their reviews. Awardees: Dr. Anand Raja, Dr. Deepti Chaudhary, Dr. Kanika Kapur, Dr. Ankit Jain, Dr. Kazi, and Dr. Garvit Chitkara. Each received a certificate, a Springer Gold Medal, a US \$300 voucher, and a token of appreciation.

b. **Author Awards:** Authors of the three most cited and three most downloaded articles were felicitated to acknowledge their contribution to the journal's impact.

c. IJSO Workshop: A workshop on "Writing, Publishing, and Thriving in Surgery" was conducted for young surgeons. Participants were trained on manuscript preparation, publication ethics, and the editorial process. A post-workshop assessment identified three top participants, with the highest scorer offered a three-month Guest Editorship with IJSO.

d. Dissertation-to-Publication Initiative:

Dissertation-to-Publication Initiative (New): The Editorial Board proposed a new initiative titled "Dissertation to Publication." Newly qualified DNB and MCh graduates will be encouraged to convert their dissertations into manuscripts and submit them to IJSO. The IJSO Editorial Board will identify high-quality dissertations and provide guidance, mentoring, and editorial support to help these trainees publish their work in IJSO. Detailed guidelines will be circulated soon.

5. Reimbursement of Travel Charges

The matter was discussed in detail with the Executive Committee of the IASO. It was unanimously decided that a total of five travel grant reimbursements for the travel expenses of the IJSO Editorial Board will be provided to the Editor-in-Chief, Executive Editor, and three Joint Editors (or their representatives) attending NATCON 2025 as part of the IASO Executive Committee. The Secretary, IASO, confirmed that the proposal would be placed before the IASO General Body Meeting for final approval.

6. Proposal to Increase Publication Frequency

Considering that more than 200 manuscripts are currently pending publication and in issue, the Editorial Board recommended increasing the publication frequency of IJSO from bimonthly to monthly. It was also shared with the Executive Committee of the IASO that the number of manuscript submissions has risen substantially, demonstrating the journal's growing credibility and reach. After a detailed discussion, the proposal was unanimously approved.

7. Statement of Accounts

The annual financial report of IJSO was presented by Dr. S. P. Somashekhar, Editor-in-Chief, and was noted by all members.

8. Any Other Matter

No additional items were raised for discussion

9. Vote of Thanks

The meeting concluded with a vote of thanks by Dr. S. P. Somashekhar, who appreciated the active participation and continued support of all board members and the Springer representatives.



Minutes of the IASO AGM held During NATCON 2025

1. Call to Order and Welcome Address

The Annual General Body Meeting of the Indian Association of Surgical Oncology (IASO) was formally called to order by **Dr Sharad Desai**, who delivered the opening remarks. He welcomed all members present and thanked them for their continued support and active participation in the association's activities.

2. Secretary's Annual Report

The Annual Report was presented by the **Secretary, Dr Rudra Prasad Acharya**, covering the following key points:

a. Membership Status

The total number of IASO members as on **01 October 2025** was reported to be **2,551**, reflecting the steady growth of the association.

b. IASO Elections 2025

The Secretary formally declared the results of the **IASO Elections 2025** and congratulated the newly elected office bearers and Executive Committee members.

c. Academic and Educational Activities

An overview of various academic initiatives and educational programmes conducted under the aegis of IASO and its members was presented. These included, but were not limited to:

- SCOPE and Cadaveric Workshops
- Skill Enhancement Workshops
- Oncoplastic Breast Surgery Workshops
- CME programmes organised by the Andhra Pradesh Association of Surgical Oncology
- East Zonal Oncology Conference

These activities were highlighted as significant contributions towards capacity building and academic excellence in surgical oncology.

d. Financial Contributions to IASO

The Secretary acknowledged and recorded the following contributions:

- **NATCON Bengaluru Organising Committee:** ₹10,00,000/-
- **Dr Arnab Gupta, East Zonal Oncology Conference:** ₹25,000/-

e. International Collaborations

Members were informed about the strengthening of international academic partnerships through the signing of Memoranda of Understanding (MoUs) with leading global surgical oncology societies, namely:

- Society of Surgical Oncology (SSO)
- British Society of Surgical Oncology (BSSO)
- European Society of Surgical Oncology (ESSO)

3. Treasurer's Report

The **Outgoing Treasurer, Dr Saikat Gupta**, presented the Annual Income and Expenditure Statement of IASO. He informed the members that all pending **GST liabilities** had been amicably resolved with the assistance of the GST consultant, **Dr Aranya Krishna**.

The Income-Expenditure Statements along with Income Tax filings for the financial years **2023-24** and **2024-25** were placed before the General Body. After due discussion, the accounts were **approved and passed unanimously** by the members present.

4. Conference Updates

The **Outgoing Secretary** updated the members on the preparedness of **MIDCON 2025**, scheduled to be held on **7th and 8th February 2025 at Raipur**.

Subsequently, the **Organising Secretary of NATCON 2026** briefed the General Body regarding the progress and preparedness for **NATCON 2026**, scheduled to be held on **9th, 10th, and 11th October 2026 at Lucknow**, and extended a warm invitation to all members.

5. Finalisation of MIDCON 2027 Venue

The venue for **MIDCON 2027** was discussed. Three bids were received from **Varanasi, Jaipur, and Rajahmundry**. After due deliberation and voting by the General Body, **Jaipur** was selected and awarded the hosting rights for MIDCON 2027.

It was further informed that **NATCON 2027** would be **amalgamated with the International Cancer Congress (ICC)** scheduled to be held at **Chennai**.

6. Closure of Meeting

As there were no further points or queries raised by the members, the meeting was formally concluded. The outgoing office bearers welcomed and congratulated the **newly elected Executive Committee and Office Bearers**, wishing them success in their forthcoming term.

Minutes of the EC Meeting (Virtual) dt 28 Oct 2025

1. Opening of the Session

The Golden Jubilee logo was **unanimously appreciated and approved**. The EC and Secretary congratulated **Dr. Naveen** for his efforts and valuable contribution.

11. Golden Jubilee Outreach Program

Ideas such as a **walkathon, bike ride, or awareness run** during NATCON were discussed. Members were encouraged to explore further possibilities and contribute additional suggestions.

12. Online Meeting Platform Subscription

16. ASICON 2025 – IASO Section

During the meeting, I presented a novel and unique e-poster titled *iCRS Alert*, a predictive model and smartphone application utilizing inflammatory biomarkers to anticipate postoperative complications in carcinoma ovary patients undergoing interval cytoreductive surgery (CRS) and HIPEC. Sessions also addressed evolving treatment modalities, including discussions on gastric carcinoma managed with PIPAC and HIPEC, further elaborated by Dr Bijelic. Before the congress concluded, I revisited several posters focused on surgical innovation leaving Gothenburg with a wealth of new ideas, perspectives, and professional connections.

Report on Attendance at ESSO 44 Congress (Gothenburg, Sweden | 15-17 October 2025)

I had the privilege of attending the 44th Congress of the European Society of Surgical Oncology (ESSO 44), held in Gothenburg, Sweden, from 15 to 17 October 2025. Day-wise Summary

Day 1 (15 October):

The sessions on breast surgery, colorectal oncology, and career growth were particularly insightful and motivating.

Day 3 (17 October)

The final day focused on tumour-site updates in sarcoma and peritoneal malignancies, followed by discussions about the future of global surgical oncology training. I spent time revisiting several posters on surgical innovation and artificial intelligence before the congress concluded, leaving with many new ideas and connections.

Key Outcomes

- Presented both a Spotlight Poster and an E-Poster successfully.
- Networked with senior ESSO leadership and Young ESSO members.
- Gained valuable insights into current trends such as localisation technologies, intraoperative imaging, minimally invasive surgery, and evolving models of surgical oncology education.
- Identified potential areas for collaboration and trainee-led research initiatives.

Conclusion

Attending ESSO 44 was an academically enriching experience that broadened my international exposure and strengthened my understanding of contemporary trends in surgical oncology. The interactions, feedback, and scientific content from this congress will significantly inform my ongoing research and clinical training.
